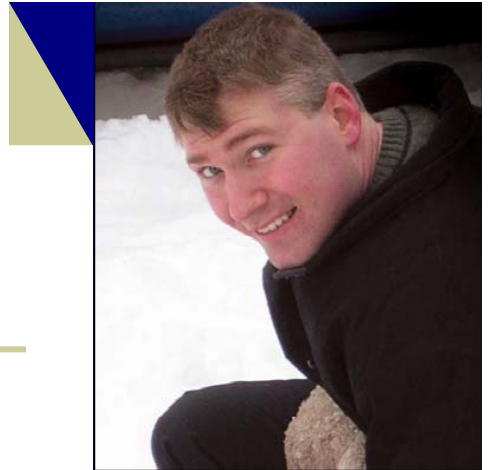


# Evolutionary Requirements Workshop
